In compliance with the Fifth Judicial District Emergency Operations Plan

In compliance with the Orders of the Pennsylvania Supreme Court and President Judge Kim Berkeley Clark, this Court and its staff are working remotely until the termination of the Judicial Emergency.

This interim procedure expresses our collective best effort to facilitate your case through advanced communication technology such as conference calling and video conferencing. We reserve the right to prioritize cases and promise to do the best we can under difficult circumstances. We will continue to encourage consent agreements and will do our best to hold conciliations and hear argument on motions in a timely fashion.

Procedures for the Allegheny County “Save Your Home” Program

- Sheriff Sales in April and May 2020 were continued until June and July 2020 by order of court.
- The Court will do everything it can to accommodate all parties in these uncertain times and recognizes attorney requests for more court time in anticipation of the economic consequences to homeowners.
- The April 14, 2020 conciliations were rescheduled to August 11 and 13, 2020 due to the current judicial emergency.
