

Allegheny County Juvenile Probation's 2021 Balanced and Restorative Justice Report Card

Since 1996, Balanced and Restorative Justice (BARJ) has been the legislative mandate and mission of Allegheny County and Pennsylvania's juvenile justice systems, establishing community protection, accountability, and competency development as system goals. Pennsylvania's Juvenile Justice System Enhancement Strategy (JJSES), created in 2010, fundamentally changed how we achieve BARJ by adding evidence-based practices, data-driven decision making, and professional development as goals.

Since 1998, Allegheny County Juvenile Probation has measured intermediate outcomes related to BARJ. This data is collected at time of case closing. This year's report card represents 600 youth whose involvement with the Department, including extended service, consent decree, probation, and/or placement, ended in 2021. The charts on the next page gauge our progress toward our six goals.



Community Protection

88% of youth successfully completed supervision




- Percentage of Youth with Closed Cases

Successful completion is defined as no new offense resulting in a Consent Decree, Adjudication of Delinquency, or finding of guilt in a criminal proceeding while under the Court's supervision.


Competency Development

85% of youth were involved in a productive competency development activity at case closing



Accountability

99% of youth fully completed community service, and 83% fully paid restitution to victims at time of case case closing

Data-Driven Decision Making

The risk level of most youth decreased at time of case closing in 2021, as measured by the validated Youth Level of Service risk 100% assessment instrument 80% -**70**% 60% 40% 27% 20% 6% 3% 0% Moderate Initial Risk Level High or Very High Initial Risk Level
