To the Citizens of Allegheny County:

Since 1996, achieving Balanced and Restorative Justice has been Juvenile Probation's legislative mandate and mission. For over 20 years, we have focused on attaining the three Balanced and Restorative Justice goals:

-  Protecting the community
-  Holding juveniles accountable to restore victims and communities
-  Helping juveniles develop competency skills that lead to law-abiding and productive citizenship

These goals have been refined and clarified over the last two decades but remain our guiding principles. How we achieve those goals has been fundamentally transformed during the last several years. A plethora of research related to "what works" with juvenile offenders has caused research and practice to be interwoven as never before. Terms such as criminogenic needs, dynamic and static risk assessment, responsibility, and fidelity, unheard of a few years ago, are now part of our everyday vernacular. While our sights remain firmly fixed on our Balanced and Restorative Justice goals, how we conduct business to attain those goals is forever changed by evidence-based research and practice.

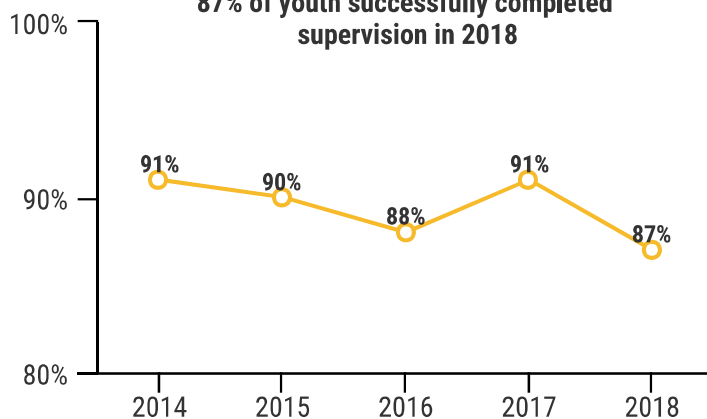

Community Protection

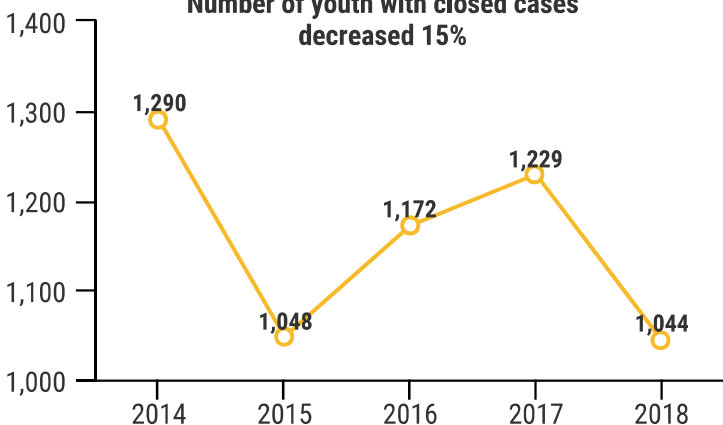
87% of youth successfully completed supervision in 2018

Percentage of Youth with Closed Cases

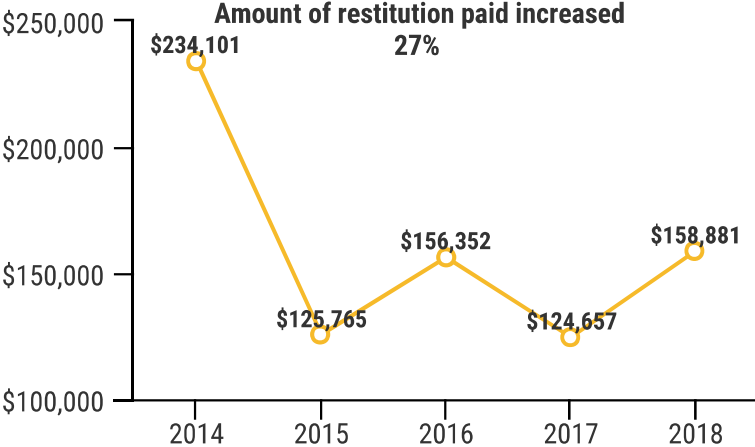
Number of youth with closed cases decreased 15%



Number of Closed Cases

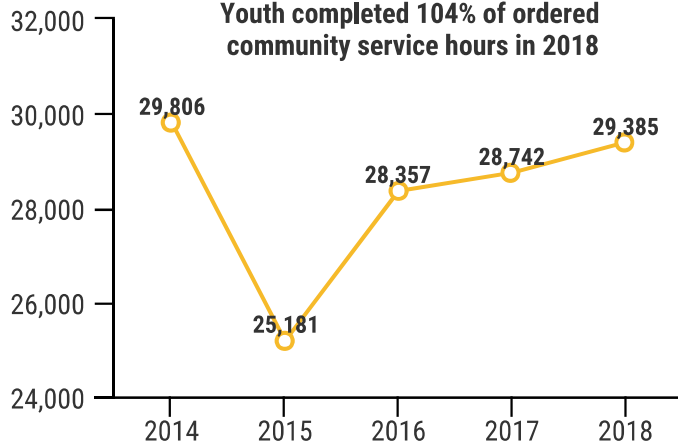
Accountability

Amount of restitution paid increased 27%



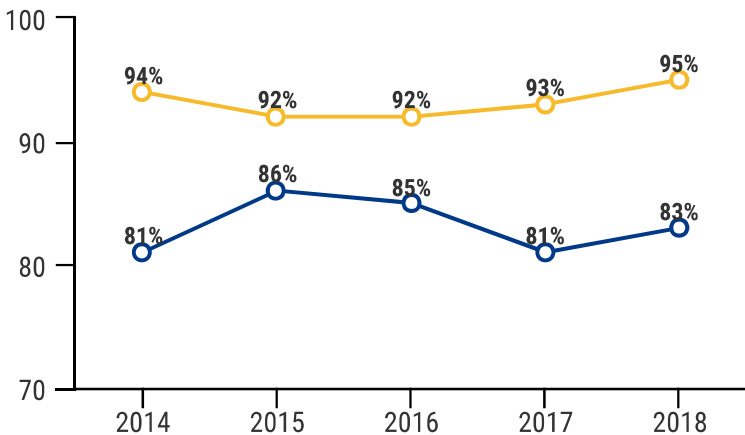
Amount of Restitution Paid

Percentage of youth who paid restitution and completed community service hours in full increased to 83% and 95%, respectively

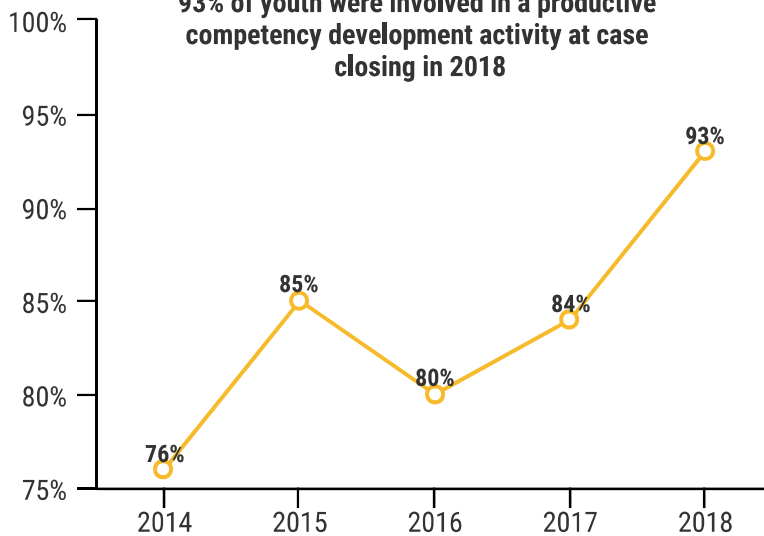


Percentage of Youth Restitution Paid in Full
